Students should self-place at RUSS 101 <u>only</u> if they have never taken any Russian. Students should also consider study abroad and/or summer courses. Any transfer credit, dual enrollment credit, credit by exam, and AP credit will help reduce the number of courses needed per semester. Finishing a Double Major fulfills GEF 8.
