

Suggested Plan of Study Double Major in Russian and History

Students should always take the Russian placement test and start at the level in which they place. Placing at the right level is crucial. Students should self-place at RUSS 101 only if they have never taken any Russian. Students should also consider study abroad and/or summer courses. Any transfer credit, dual enrollment credit, credit by exam, and AP credit will help reduce the number of courses needed per semester. Finishing a Double Major fulfills GEF 8.
