<u>Dissertation Title:</u> "Creolizing Explorations: Trajectories, Relation, and Decentering Imaginaries in Francophone Caribbean and Indian Ocean Fictions"

Abstract: I examine literary representations of marginal experiences in the context of transnational migration. I foreground my concept, Creolizing Explorations, as an integrated and comparative framework that brings together fictions from Creole islands: Mauritius, Guadeloupe, Haiti, La Réunion. My research underscores how these works recalibrate our understanding of migrant figures and migrants' agency. I posit that these texts depict migrating characters as active agents of change and creolization, and, I argue, as explorers.
